The Georgia Bulldog Club (TGBC) is the fundraising arm of the University of Georgia Athletic Association.


Membership is accomplished by making a contribution to at least one of the many student-athlete enhancement funds that makeup The Georgia Bulldog Club.


The commitments of TGBC donors like you in support of Georgia athletes serve as the lifeblood of UGA's athletic department.

TGBC PRIORITY POINTS SYSTEM



Priority points are accumulated over a donor's lifetime of giving to The Georgia Bulldog Club. Ticket assignments, parking assignments, and other benefits associated with each annual fund are assigned in priority point order from top to bottom. Priority points are earned by making donations to the Georgia Bulldog Club.



Annual Giving Memberships

For every dollar you donate to one of our annual giving funds (Hartman Fund, Basketball Enhancement Fund, Gymnastics Endowment Fund, Georgia Baseball Fund, and Women's Basketball Fund), donors receive one Priority Point added to your cumulative TGBC points total.

For every dollar donated to The Magill Society, donors receive one and a half Priority Points added to your cumulative TGBC priority points total.




The Magill Society (\$100,000+), paid over a 5-year period


Student-athletes will immediately experience increased levels of development, instruction, and care in every facet of their daily routines.


