
The Georgia Bulldog Club (TGBC) is the fundraising arm of the University of Georgia Athletic Association.

Ticket assignments, parking assignments, and other benefits associated with each annual fund are assigned in priority point order from top to bottom. Priority points are earned by making donations to the Georgia Bulldog Club.






All Magill Society members are given access to exclusive events such as: **FB Signing Day, G-Day, Open FB Practices, Post-Season Events, Paint the "G", Open Basketball Practices & an Enhanced Stegmania Experience.**

At the **\$50,000** giving level & above, donors will have the first opportunity to purchase spots on an annual football away game donor trip.

Once per season, donors at the **\$100,000** level & above will have a one-on-one experience with the football student-athletes & coaches as they enter the stadium.

Pre-game field access is granted for donors that make commitments at the **\$250,000** level & above.

Members at the **\$250,000** level & above have the opportunity for on-field recognition during a home football game.








Men's Basketball:

23.8%




Gymnastics:











Butts-Mehre Expansion Project

Although the Dawgs spend their Saturdays in Sanford Stadium each fall, this facility serves Georgia Football's day-to-day operations. This capital project will create 164,000 square feet of new and renovated space.

Student-athletes will immediately experience increased levels of development, instruction, and care in every facet of their daily routines.

This project will encompass all areas of support for the program including NEW:

- weight room
- locker room
- sports medicine area
- nutrition area, coaches' offices
- team meeting rooms

When complete, this facility will further the standard that UGA Football is setting for all of college football.


