





2018 UGAAA Revenue Breakdown





Renewable Season Ticket Requests: Hartman Fund members who contribute their minimum per-seat donation and purchase season tickets will have right to renew their season tickets. All requests are fulfilled based on priority and availability.

Renewable Parking Pass Requests: Hartman Fund members who contribute \$2,500 or more and purchase football season tickets, will have the right to renew their season parking pass. All requests are fulfilled based on priority and availability.

Membership Packet: Includes a 2019 Football schedule magnet, car decals, and a TGBC branded gift.

Priority Points

2019 HARTMAN FUND DONOR GUIDE

Priority Points: The Georgia Bulldog Club calculates your priority point total based on cumulative giving towards UGA Athletics. Members are ranked in order based on cumulative priority point total for ticket opportunities including renewable season, single home and away games, the Georgia versus Florida game, and all postseason competitions if Georgia participates. This includes SEC Championship, neutral site, bowl games and the College Football Playoff. Priority parking opportunities include the home football season and the Georgia/Florida game in Jacksonville.

Obtaining Football Season Tickets

2019 HARTMAN FUND DONOR GUIDE

A contribution to the 2019 Hartman Fund provides you with the opportunity to request renewable season, single home game, away game and/or post-season tickets. Eligibility for season tickets at Sanford Stadium is a two-step process: a 2019 Hartman Fund donation followed by a season ticket payment.

STEP 1: Make one or several contribution(s) prior to the February 15, 2019 deadline.

- » Please make a contribution you are comfortable with, as a donation does not guarantee assignment of new season tickets.
- » Each section in Sanford Stadium has a per-seat contribution requirement. If you are interested in receiving season tickets for the first time, you may make the per-seat contribution associated with a specific section; however, this does not guarantee assignment in that section as **assignment is based on priority points and availability.**

STEP 2: Submit your season ticket application and ticket payment prior to the March 31, 2019 deadline.

- » All 2019 Hartman Fund members will receive a season ticket application available online or via mail in early March.
- Donations to the Hartman Fund, Magill Society pledge payments, and any sport specific or endowment gifts made prior to the March 31 deadline will increase your priority point total for the optional football season ticket selection/ allocation process.

Members who request, but do not receive season tickets will have the first opportunity to purchase any Football mini-packages and single game tickets that become available.



Renewing/Relocating/Adding Football Season Tickets

2019 HARTMAN FUND DONOR GUIDE



This year, we will introduce a new interactive online seat allocation process that will enable you to personally select football season ticket relocations and/or new season tickets based upon availability and TGBC priority. This initiative is being implemented to continue to provide customer service based on our fundamental principles of fairness, loyalty and transparency in recognizing the impact of your support of Georgia student-athletes. More information will be made available prior to the process which will occur in May.

Please follow the steps outlined below to renew your season tickets, be considered to relocate or add season tickets.

RENEW TICKETS

Step 1: Make one or several contribution(s) to the Hartman Fund prior to the **February 15, 2019** deadline, ensuring you meet or exceed your per-seat giving requirement.

Step 2: Submit your season ticket application and ticket payment prior to the *March 31, 2019* deadline via your online account or mail to the UGA Athletic Ticket Office.

RELOCATE TICKETS

Step 1: Make one or several contributions prior to the **February 15, 2019** deadline, to renew your current seats and boost your point total during the online seat allocation process. <u>Making the donation associated with a specific section does not guarantee relocation</u>.

Step 2: Submit your season ticket application and payment by the **March 31, 2019** deadline via your online account or by mail to the UGA Athletic Ticket office. To be considered for relocation, you must indicate this interest on your season ticket application. All relocation, new and additional season ticket requests will be placed in priority point order for the seat selection process. Should you have the opportunity to select seats in a higher per-seat gift requirement section and your current Hartman Fund contribution does not meet this minimum, you will have the opportunity to pay the difference during the online seat selection process.

ADD TICKETS

Step 1: Make one or several contribution(s) prior to the **February 15, 2019** deadline, ensuring you meet the minimum per-seat donation associated with the section of your desired additional tickets. You may have a maximum of 8 season tickets on one account, 4 of which may be assigned in the various club seating areas. Making the minimum donation associated with a specific section does not guarantee the addition of seats in that section.

Step 2: Submit your season ticket application and ticket payment for additional season tickets prior to the deadline of *March 31, 2019*. To be considered for additional tickets, you must identify on your season ticket application that you wish to do so. During the online, self-selection process you will have the ability to choose your additional tickets pending availability, and pay for applicable difference at that time. If we are unable to fulfill your request for additional season tickets, you may receive a refund for your ticket payment. You can also elect to submit that payment as a 2020 Hartman Fund contribution on your ticket application. Hartman Fund donations are non-refundable.



Game Tickets: Away Game & Single Home

2019 HARTMAN FUND DONOR GUIDE

You do not need to be a football season ticket holder in order to request away and/or single home game tickets. The season ticket application will list all available games, as well as ticket quantities, for which a member is eligible to request based on cumulative priority points and either your 2019 Hartman Fund contribution or level of involvement with the Magill Society.

The following ticket charts outline the cumulative priority points necessary to be eligible to request tickets to a specific game and the total number of tickets you may request based on your 2019 Hartman Fund contribution or level of involvement with the Magill Society. Requirements are established based on the anticipated limited number of available tickets and high demand.

Game Tickets: Away Game & Single Home

2019 HARTMAN FUND DONOR GUIDE

Away and Single Home Game Ticket Assignment Process

- » Payment for away and single home game tickets is due at the same time as season tickets: March 31, 2019. Written seating requests for away or single home games may be submitted on the ticket application or may be entered via the online ticket application.
- » Away and single home game ticket locations are assigned based on priority points and availability, whereas the quantity of tickets that you can request is based on current Hartman Fund giving or Magill Society involvement.
 Qualifying to request tickets does not guarantee assignment.
- » After the assignment process is complete, the Athletic Association will publish the priority point cutoffs on www.georgiadogs.com. If you are assigned away and/or single home game tickets, you will receive them separate from season tickets.
- » You have the opportunity to request all ticket payment refunds be applied to your 2020 Hartman Fund donation on the 2019 ticket application. Should you not qualify for single home game or away game tickets, the ticket application provides the opportunity to either receive a refund on the ticket cost or apply those dollars to next year's donation.

Postseason Ticket Assignment Process

» Your cumulative priority points determine if you are eligible to request tickets for all postseason opportunities. The donation deadline to establish point-based priority for postseason is November 1, 2019



In order to provide ample opportunities and be consistent with home game policies, each account will have access to no more than 4 tickets in any club areas at neutral site venues. All additional tickets above and beyond 4 will be allocated based on priority in non-club areas at the same time.

Priority Guidelines: Georgia/Florida

Priority Point Requirements

Your cumulative priority points determine if you are eligible to request tickets to the game against Florida, whereas the number of tickets that you are eligible to request is based on your 2019 Hartman Fund gift or involvement in the Magill Society as depicted in the chart. **Requesting game tickets does not guarantee that you will receive them as assignments are based on priority points and availability.** You do not need to be a season ticket holder to be eligible to request tickets.

- » Regular Tickets: A minimum of 10,000 cumulative points are necessary to be eligible to request regular seats. Cumulative priority point cutoffs will vary year to year.
- » Club Level Tickets: A minimum of 80,000 cumulative points are necessary to be eligible to request club seats. The 2018 cutoff for club tickets was 103,966 cumulative points. Cumulative priority point cutoffs will vary year to year.



In order to provide ample opportunities and be consistent with home game policies, each account will have access to no more than 4 tickets in any club areas at neutral site venues. All additional tickets above and beyond 4 will be allocated based on priority in non-club areas at the same time.

Georgia/Florida Parking

- » 2019 Hartman Fund members who contribute \$5,000 or more annually and receive Georgia/Florida tickets through the Athletic Association have the opportunity to receive a parking pass for the game.
- » 2019 Hartman Fund members who contribute \$10,000 or more annually and receive Georgia/Florida tickets through the Athletic Association will receive a second parking pass.
- » All parking passes for the Georgia/Florida game are free of charge and assigned based on priority points and availability.





The Hedges is an exclusive group of TGBC members whose overall contributions total \$100,000 or more to TGBC in a giving year. Members of The Hedges are fans, friends and alumni whose generosity immediately improves the overall landscape of UGA Athletics through capital project gifts, scholarship endowments, sport-specific gifts and annual priority seating fund gifts. Members of The Hedges are eligible to receive the following benefits:

- » A private dinner with the UGA Director of Athletics or UGA Head Coach based on availability.
- » Specialized UGA gear featuring The Hedges logo.
- » Sideline access for the annual G Day spring football game.
- » Opportunity to attend one (1) private practice for football, men's basketball and women's basketball.
- » Increased ticket allotment (based on availability) for football neutral site games, SEC Championship, Georgia/Florida, and bowl games.
- » Two field passes for one (1) home UGA Football game.
- » On-field/On-Court recognition for one (1) home football game or (1) home men's basketball game.

Requirements

The University of Georgia Athletic Association recognizes donors who make commitments of \$1 million or more, payable over five years, as members of Athletics' most exclusive donor group: The Silver Circle. Current gifts of cash, stock, real estate, as well as irrevocable planned gifts are eligible. Irrevocable planned gifts will be recognized posthumously with tickets and benefits assigned to a designated family member in one's will.

Benefits

- Members have the ability to designate their athletic ticket priorities to family members or friends.
 All priority points, tickets and parking may be passed down. This is a one-time only designation.
- » Priority points and tickets may be split between multiple designated family members or friends if the Silver Circle member desires.
- » The UGA Athletic Association will provide one complimentary SEC or National Championship ring or pendant of the sport of member's choice each year. Members will also have the opportunity to purchase an additional ring or pendant for their spouse.
- » Members will be recognized during a home football game on the playing field, one time.
- » Members will receive invitations to Magill Society, Hedges, and Athletic Association special events.
- » Special naming opportunities will be discussed and approved according to University of Georgia policy.
- » Current benefit of having your away, neutral site, and postseason game tickets allocated prior to other donor groups during the priority ticket allocation process.
- » Increased ticket allotment (based on availability) for Football neutral site games, SEC Championship, Georgia/Florida, and bowl games.
- » Stewardship inclusive of The Magill Society and The Hedges donor groups for five years.

Georgia Always is an exclusive society honoring individuals who leave the ultimate legacy for UGA student-athletes, coaches, staff and athletic programs through planned gifts. These funds ensure the Athletic Association's ability to fulfill its long-term vision through support of scholarships, endowments, facility improvement, and other support funds. University of Georgia alumni and friends who are dedicated to the continued success of Georgia's student-athletes can make a lasting imprint on the program by contributing to the Athletic Association through various avenues of planned giving.

Three simple ways to make a planned gift to benefit Georgia Athletics

- » Bequest: Designate the "University of Georgia Foundation, for benefit of UGA Athletics" as a beneficiary of your estate by will or trust.
- » Retirement Plan Assets: Contact your plan administrator to name "University of Georgia Foundation, for benefit of UGA Athletics" beneficiary of all or a portion of your unused retirement assets such as a gift from your IRA, 401(k), 403(b), pension or other tax-deferred plan.
- » **IRA Rollover:** Transfer up to \$100,000 per year from an IRA to satisfy the required minimum distribution for the year (eligible if 70½ years or above, provides immediate Magill Society membership based on cash value of gift).

NOTES:

- At the time of donation, the new member must submit either a Refer A Bulldog form (located online at www.thegeorgiabulldogclub.com) or submit the current member name and account number when donating online. The referral cannot take place after the donation has been made. It must be made at the time of the new donation.
- Referral points do not count toward any annual per-seat giving requirement. They are strictly added as a credit to the member's cumulative priority points total.
- Credit point credit will be added after the Hartman Fund deadline and will be visible in the cumulative total prior to seating allocation.

Why should I donate to The Georgia Bulldog Club?

Private support is essential to the success of UGA student-athletes and the UGA Athletic Association (UGAAA). UGAAA receives no financial assistance from the state of Georgia. It is a self-funded entity, solely dependent upon self-generated revenues to operate and provide student-athlete scholarships, build world-class athletic facilities and ensure UGA's tradition of athletic excellence continues to grow.

How do I become a member of The Georgia Bulldog Club?

You can become a member of The Georgia Bulldog Club (TGBC) by donating a minimum of \$100 to the Hartman Fund. In addition, there are also a variety of other ways to join/support UGA Athletics by making contributions to the Basketball Enhancement Fund, the Gymnastics Endowment Fund, the Georgia Baseball Fund, the Magill Society, the Endowment Program and via sport-specific giving opportunities.

How much do I have to donate to acquire new football season tickets?

Fans who are interested in securing new football season tickets must complete two steps in order to request season tickets. First, you must make a qualifying Hartman Fund donation by February 15, 2019 that meets or exceeds the per-seat giving requirement associated with the season tickets that you are interested in securing*. A full map of Sanford Stadium on page 10 has the corresponding minimum per-seat giving requirements associated with season tickets in each section. Second, you must submit a season ticket application with payment by March 31, 2019.

*Making the per-seat minimum contribution does not guarantee that you will have the opportunity to secure new seats in a desired section. Determining the priority cutoff for new season ticket acquisitions in various sections in Sanford Stadium is difficult to project as it based on attrition and member demand.

What is the best way to increase my priority point ranking?

The best way to increase your priority point ranking is to join the Magill Society, which awards bonus priority points for commitments of \$25,000 or greater that are made payable over a 5-year period of time. Increasing your support to the Hartman Fund is also a great way to increase your priority point total and improve your ranking. Lastly, referring new TGBC and/or Magill Society members is another way to help grow the base of support towards UGA Athletics while also increasing your priority point total and ranking amongst our members.

How do I relocate my football season tickets?

Members can relocate your seats within Sanford Stadium by submitting a relocation request in writing on your season ticket application. The season ticket allocation process will begin in May and conclude in June. Seat change requests will be fulfilled in priority point order. Season ticket relocation and new season ticket requests are allocated based on priority points and availability. This year, members will have the opportunity to personally select new, relocated or additional tickets if requested through our new online process.



If I request a seat relocation, and do not get it, do I keep my same seats?

Yes, if we are unable to fulfill your seat relocation request your seat location will remain the same, unless otherwise indicated. With an average renewal rate of nearly 90% each year, the relocation of seats can be very difficult.



What are the priority point cutoffs for certain sections?

Priority point cutoffs for each section can change from year-to-year. Unfortunately, it is impossible for TGBC to predict what the priority point cutoff will be for each section. We can however provide some historical perspective based on previous year cutoffs. Please feel free to contact TGBC office and we will gladly share historical cutoffs with you and provide guestimates for the upcoming year with you.



How are football season parking allocations handled?

Hartman Fund members who contribute \$2,500 or more and have purchased football season tickets will have the opportunity to request one complementary parking pass on their season ticket application. You must purchase your season tickets and contribute a minimum of \$2,500 annually to renew your parking location from the previous season. All new parking pass allocations, and requests to relocate will be assigned based upon priority during the season ticket allocation process this May.

How are away game football tickets allocated?

Away game ticket locations are allocated based on priority points whereas the number of tickets that a member is eligible to request is based on either your 2019 Hartman Fund donation or your commitment level to the Magill Society. Please see page 14 for a full breakdown on our 2019 away game quantity cutoffs and priority point requirements. Please note, new to 2019- each account will have access to no more than 4 tickets in any club areas at neutral site venues. All additional tickets above and beyond 4 will be allocated based on priority in non-club areas at the same time.

Account Guidelines/ Ways to Give

Account Guidelines

- » Members may have a maximum of 8 season tickets on one account, with no more than 4 being assigned to the club level.
- » The Georgia Bulldog Club encourages every supporter of Georgia Athletics to establish and contribute on your own account, enabling receipt of benefits associated with the account.
- » The Georgia Bulldog Club requires an account to be listed under the name of an individual and not a corporation or couple.
- > Under the new Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017, no charitable deduction is allowed for amounts paid to the UGA Athletic Association after December 31, 2017 in exchange for the right to purchase season tickets for The University of Georgia home athletic events. Accordingly, in the absence of additional guidance from the Internal Revenue Service or the Department of Treasury, your seat-related contributions for home events are no longer tax-deductible. We recommend that you consult your tax advisor to determine the potential tax-deductibility for gifts made above and beyond your per-seat-related contributions.
- » Donations to the Hartman Fund through The Georgia Bulldog Club are non-refundable.

Account Transfer Polices

- » An account, including the associated priority points and season tickets, may be transferred to a spouse only at the time of death.
- » An account, including the associated priority points, parking, and season tickets can also be transferred one-time if one is a member of the Silver Circle (see page 19).

How do I make a gift?

You may make a gift at any point during the year, keeping in mind the February 15, 2019 deadline if you have an interest in 2019 football ticket benefits.


